

Join ECO outdoors wherever you are: your yard, a nearby open field or park, on a walk around the neighborhood, or a nature trail (please pay attention to public closures!)

- Use all your senses, except for taste! What do you see? What do you hear? What do you smell? What do you feel?
- Zoom in, zoom out. Look at an object from far away and make observations, then get up close to it and make more observations.
- Be curious, respectful, and responsible. Leave plants growing where they are and observe them without picking them. Keep a safe distance from critters and observe them with your eyes only.
